
hroughout the entire Easter Season, both on Sundays and weekdays, the First Reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts tell the story of the early Church, beginning in Jerusalem and ending in Rome. In them, we hear of the struggles and accomplishments of those early followers of Jesus Christ. We witness how the apostles tried to put into practice the teachings of our Savior and the effects they had on the early Christian communities.

There are some interesting elements one can glean from today's reading from Acts. These early Christian communities lived as a distinct group that renounced individual possessions and provided for the needs of each person: This was not some form of Christian socialism but rather a manifestation of the radical charity we are called to by our Faith, putting God before our possessions. If you continue to read through the Acts of the Apostles, you will find that some iniquities arise within the communities along ethnic and economic lines, Gentile Christians vs. Jewish Christians, as well as the neglect of widows and orphans. Some doubted the sincerity of others and feared that they would miss out on something. In short, while being Christian communities, they were still human beings who found it difficult to be Christian all the time.

Our Gospel this Sunday deals with fear and doubt, two common emotions among human beings. They are survival emotions. Fear usually involves self-preservation. Doubt involves needing clarity and certainty in order to move forward. In today's Gospel, we find the disciples gathered together in a locked room for fear of being persecuted -just as Jesus had been. Suddenly, Jesus appears to them with the greeting, "Peace be with you." He is trying to put their souls at rest as only the peace of Christ can do. Their fear and doubt dissipated. The problem was, Thomas was not with them. When they told him that they had seen the Lord, he doubted them. He wanted solid proof. He demanded to see and touch Jesus' wounds before he could believe. When Jesus did appear to them again, Thomas included, our Lord once again greeted them with "Peace be with you." He immediately invited Thomas to probe the wounds on his hands and on his side. Thomas instead proclaims, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus responds, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are

those who have not seen and have believed." John 20:29

We can see from these two readings that human behavior has not changed much since the times of Christ. We try to be good Christians but sometimes our baser instincts take over. Instead of being charitable, we become selfish and greedy. Instead of forgiving, we become judgmental. Hate becomes power and forgiveness becomes weakness. We doubt long-held truths. And we fall prey to the newest and shiniest whatever. On this Divine Mercy Sunday, let's not forget that Jesus forgave the people who crucified him. After his Resurrection, he did not seek revenge, but peace. Today he



extends his love and mercy to us and asks us to do the same to all God's children. Remember, we are part of that group who have not seen, but believe, and the Lord has called us "blessed."


Cardinal Cupich's Easter Message






Every day, we have the opportunity to be the face of Jesus to others. Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- 1. If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- 2. The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3. Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

Water Prayers

Jesus meets the woman at the well and she asks him: "Give me living water always." We can continue the prayer of the Samaritan woman, and like her, we can find Jesus at the edge of the waters that we encounter every day. For example, pray this line from Psalm 51 before you get into the shower or wash your face or hands: "Wash me with fresh water, wash me bright as snow." Or use this line from Psalm 63 whenever you take up a glass of something to drink: "God, my God, you I crave; my soul thirsts for you." Try this verse from Psalm 65 when you water the garden or even your houseplants: "With softening rain you bless the land with growth." If you're sloshing around in puddles these days, pray this verse from Psalm 147: "God speaks, the ice melts. God breathes, the streams flow." And if you're surprised by a spring ice storm, here's your prayer, also from Psalm 147: "The Lord hurls chunks of hail. Who can stand such cold?"

Make up and write down a prayer giving God thanks for the gift of water or asking God's protection from its dangers.



Marriage: Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory at least six months before the wedding. The Archdiocese requires a marriage preparation program (Pre-Cana, Discovery Weekend, etc.).
