any Catholics are surprised to learn that many of the disciples were married—we know for certain that St. Peter had a mother-in-law, who is ill in today's Gospel. Jesus approaches her and helps her up, "then the fever left her and she waited on them." The men may seem inconsiderate to a woman just from her sickbed (big surprise!), but that part of the narrative perhaps highlights how complete and marvelous Christ's healing grace is. The love of Jesus lifts us all up and stirs us to serve one another joyfully with charity.

The uplifting presence of Jesus contrasts vividly with the despair and drudgery of Job in the first reading.




Cycles are a big part of the Christian tradition. The Advent wreath marks the beginning of a new liturgical cycle. The Scripture readings are set on a three-year cycle (we are in Year B—St. Mark's Gospel). We save the votive prayer petitions to burn in the Paschal fire at the Easter Vigil. In our funeral services, we are reminded of the circle of life in the words "ashes to ashes, dust to dust."

Ashes are connected to the liturgical cycle of the Church. Life sprouts from ashes as we take the palms, which have dried and withered, from last year's Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and burn them to mark the beginning of Lent. You can bring your palms to church or drop them off at the parish office by Tuesday, February 13. We will burn them in in our Memorial Garden (east end of the church, off the parking lot). Please remove any staples, paper clips, string, tape, or other fasteners.

Mustard Seeds of Faith

You might be surprised that when you use a pronoun to indicate God (Father, Son, or Holy Spirit), you need not capitalize the first letter. Many people were taught by their teachers, nuns, or priests to do so. But the style the Catholic Church uses in the Roman Missal (check *Missalette*) and Bible translations does not capitalize divine pronouns.

Mark Ward writes in "Why We Should Not Capitalize Deity Pronouns When Referring to God":


Choosing to capitalize deity pronouns in Scripture creates awkward situations—such as when the Pharisees say to Jesus (New American Standard Bible), "We wish to see a sign from You," implying that they do in fact regard him as deity. [Note: The Catholic New American Bible, used at Mass, reads: "Teacher, we wish to see a sign from you."] This practice forces us to specify whether a given pronoun refers to God in ambiguous cases; it also shouts interpretations that authors may have preferred to whisper (Is 53:6—"But the LORD laid upon him the guilt of us all." NAB). And as the Zondervan style guide wisely points out, capitalization in English doesn't generally mean respect, but specification (see "Pol Pot" and "Satan").

The practice of capitalizing divine pronouns arose in the 1800s, but has more recently faded. Also, lowercase letters were a relatively later development. In the time of Christ, the Roman alphabet and Latin only used what we now call uppercase letters. (There was a lot of shouting in early manuscripts;) The copying of manuscripts and the printing press led to the evolution of miniscule, or lowercase, letters.

You are not mistaken if you prefer to capitalize pronouns that reference God. But people who do not capitalize are not wrong, nor are they showing disrespect to our beloved Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. They are following the preferred style of the Vatican documents and Catholic biblical scholarship.




Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession): Saturdays 3:00 to 3:45 p.m. or by appointment


