
On this Second Sunday of Lent our readings go from the unthinkable to the incredible; from the horrifying to the holy. We begin with our First Reading, taken from the Book of Genesis. It tells us a story about Abraham and his son Isaac. The story of Abraham began when God told him to leave his native land to go to a place that was unknown to him. Abraham did so as an act of faith. God had made a covenant with him and promised him descendants as numerous as the stars of the sky. He also gave Abraham and Sarah a son, Isaac, in their old age. In today's reading, God asks him to do the unthinkable: to sacrifice his only son, the one who was the hope for numerous descendants. How could Abraham have descendants "as numerous as the stars of the sky" if he had to sacrifice his only son? Abraham trusted that God would be faithful to his promise but did not know how. At the last moment, as Abraham was getting ready to slaughter his son, a messenger of the Lord called out to him to stop. Because of his obedience and willingness to withhold nothing from the Lord, the Lord rewards Abraham and reiterates his promise to make his descendants "as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore." Gen. 22:17

The story of Abraham and Isaac is often called the sacrifice of Isaac, but that is a misnomer. The Jewish description of it is "the binding of Isaac" ("Aqedah") and is more accurate since Isaac is not sacrificed. In any event, that is a terrifying and unthinkable thing to be asked to do: To think about sacrificing a loved one. On the other hand, how great was Abraham's faith that he believed that, somehow, God would make things work



out in the end? This reminds me of a quote from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.: "Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see. the whole staircase." Abraham took that first step.

Our Gospel reading is equally dramatic but in a completely different way. An incredible event happens as Jesus leads Peter, James, and John to a mountain top. Upon arriving, Jesus is transfigured before them (in Greek, metamorphoo) and Moses and Elijah appear, conversing with Jesus! Peter suggests they build three tents, so that they could remain there in the presence of Moses the Lawgiver and Elijah the Prophet. A cloud hovers over them and from it a voice proclaims: "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Listen, that is, to what he has



been saying about going up to Jerusalem to suffer and die. This "peak experience" as the theologian Paul Tillich would call it, could not go on forever, however. Rather than allowing the disciples to set up tents and remain in the "high" of this experience, Jesus immediately leads them back down the mountain. They needed to go back down to where the world awaited them and to where their real work was to be done: To where they would witness Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection.

These two readings are extreme examples of faith and encounters with God. How terrifying was it for Abraham to think he would have to sacrifice his only son? The Gospel tells us that Peter, James, and John were also terrified upon seeing a transfigured Jesus, along with Moses and Elijah. Taking these two scenarios and putting them into the context of our own lives this Lent, I invite you to think about difficult choices you have had to make during your life and how you felt as you were making them. Think also of times when you felt that you were truly in the presence of God and how that felt. Whether you felt it or not, God was there in the difficult times as well as the joyful ones.

This Friday evening, March 1, Bishop Dan Turley will be the conferring the Sacrament of Confirmation upon the St. Cajetan 8<sup>th</sup> Grade School and Religious Education students (and one from St. John Fisher...) This is an important day in the Faith life of these students as they become fully initiated adults in their Catholic Faith. Keep them in your prayers.



During the season of Lent, we are invited to reflect on our values as Christians and recommit to living them out in our lives. As we commit ourselves to fasting and praying, among other things, we also commit to "give alms," to share our resources with our neighbors who are in need. This year, the St. John Fisher community is invited to share its resources with neighbors served by Taller de José

Taller de José is a community resource center, located in Chicago's Little Village, which offers accompaniment to people in need, connecting people to services and services to people. Founded by the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Taller de José exists to fulfill the mission of Jesus, "that all may be one."

Accompaniment is a unique service in a city abounding with government agencies and resources. The staff of Taller de José offers companionship and personal attention to underserved people to help them to navigate the social service system and connect them to the resources they need. While accompanying a client, the staff is a supportive

presence, at times offering information, translation, direction, emotional support, and advocacy for the client. Staff members also accompany clients by physically walking with them to appointments and services throughout Chicago via public transportation.

### Hot Topics—Archdiocesan Women's Committee

#### **Inspiring Pastoral Outreach**

Join the AWC for one of three Zoom discussions on pastoral approaches to persons in unchangeable positions that put them in conflict with the teachings of the Catholic Church (for example, Catholics who are divorced and re-married without an annulment, who identify as LGBTQIA+, are in inter-religious marriages, whose marriages were not blessed by the Church, etc.).


