Fr. Marty's Musings

Lent is a season to celebrate, beginning with ashes smudging our foreheads as a reminder of our faults and mortality, but inevitably guiding us to the Easter joy of Christ Risen. We reach renewal through reconciliation. May we build the Church with hope for the restoration that Lent offers and that we desperately need. The first Lent preface proclaims, “For by your gracious gift each year your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure...” Lent should challenge but not embitter us. Though penitential, it points us to the generous mercy of God. The prayer, fasting, and alms giving we commit to set the stage for the joyous Paschal feast.

Sundays are not considered fasting days. In Lent we set aside the “Gloria” but still praise God for the Easter miracle. The Lenten journey reminds us that it is not things we are willing to give up that bring us true joy. We open ourselves to the eternal gifts from God that bring enduring jubilation.



In the cacophony of modern life, we can be uncomfortable with and do not know how to handle silence. We sometimes struggle to find the opportunity or justification to pause for spiritual reflection. Find some light in the gloom of winter by embracing a moment of quiet prayer and reflection. Pick up and share a copy of *The Word Among Us* for Lent. It offers daily liturgical readings and prayers, but also provides meditations.

Mustard Seeds of Faith: Church and the Creed

A couple weeks ago, we informed that pronouns referring to God need not be capitalized. Did you ever notice in the Nicene Creed — “I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church” — that

“catholic” is not capitalized? You might also be surprised that Episcopalians, Lutherans, and many mainline Protestants profess belief in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. We do not capitalize the “C” because it does not refer to the branch of Christianity that we occupy, the Roman Catholic Church, but to the original meaning of “catholic” — universal.

We, along with many of our other Christian sisters and brothers, profess faith in a Church that is one—Christ wants unity as his Body. The Church is holy—God forms it, humanity did not create it. The Church is catholic—Christ’s invitation is universal, open to all. And the Church is apostolic—we have our continuous roots in the mission and leadership that Jesus entrusted to his Apostles.

As “Big C” Church references the people of God as the Body of Christ and “little c” church is the building where we worship, “Big C” Catholic defines those who acknowledge Pope Francis as St. Peter’s successor, and “little c” catholic means Christ’s universal, all-encompassing invite.

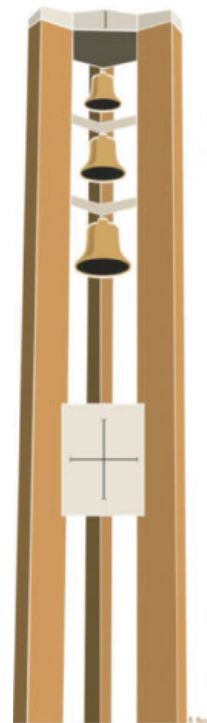
St. John Fisher Parish Mission Statement

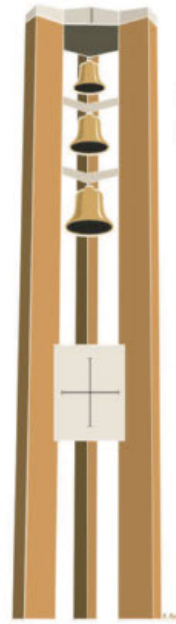

Hot Topics—Archdiocesan Women's Committee

Inspiring Pastoral Outreach

Join the AWC for one of three Zoom discussions on pastoral approaches to persons in unchangeable positions that put them in conflict with the teachings of the Catholic Church (for example, Catholics who are divorced and re-married without an annulment, who identify as LGBTQIA+, are in inter-religious marriages, whose marriages were not blessed by the Church, etc.).

Our goal is to hear the voices of 200 or more women. Discussion will address the following:

- Do the Church's current practices towards persons in these situations attract people to or drive them away from the Catholic Church?
- What are some pastoral approaches that you have seen, or would like to see, toward persons who are in these situations? In what ways could we encourage them and help them feel comfortable coming to church?
- Do you or do people you know feel injured or harbor resentment when exceptions are made for people in these situations?

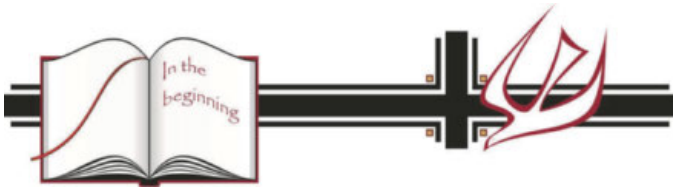
