## Fr. Marty's Musings

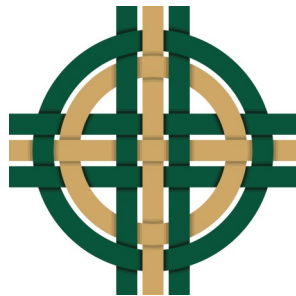
### Céad míle fáilte

A hundred thousand welcomes to all who gather to celebrate our faith, our community, Irish heritage for many this Sunday, and St. Patrick. Our parish welcomes many from throughout the South Side and suburbs. We will march together with a parade publicly proclaiming our pride in our faith and community. The abundance of three-leaf shamrocks see each March reminds us of our faith in a triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

St. Patrick was not born in Ireland—he was first taken there unwillingly by kidnappers and forced to be a shepherd. He later returned by choice to spread the Gospel of the Good Shepherd to the Celts. He carried out a mission of conversion, but he also reminds us that our faith and Church have been formed and spread by immigrants. When many Irish came to America to escape the Great Hunger, they did not always receive a warm welcome. The Know Nothing party campaigned against the waves of Catholics from Ireland and elsewhere.

On his feast day, March 17, let us find him a faith figure that still inspires us. He calls on the enveloping protection of God in The Breastplate of St. Patrick (or Deer's Cry), written around 433 A.D. Here is a section:

Christ with me,  
 Christ before me,  
 Christ behind me,  
 Christ in me,  
 Christ beneath me,  
 Christ above me,  
 Christ on my right,  
 Christ on my left,  
 Christ when I lie down,  
 Christ when I sit down,  
 Christ when I arise,  
 Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me,  
 Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me,  
 Christ in every eye that sees me,  
 Christ in every ear that hears me.



As Cillian Murphy said at the Oscars, Go raibh míle maith agaibh (a thousand thanks) to all who worked hard to bring the celebration together!

Our pastor, Fr. Ken Budzikowski, presides at the Parade kick-off Mass this year. Although the name Budzikowski is proudly Polish, St. Kenneth/St. Canice of Aghaboe was born in Glengiven Ireland a century after Patrick. County Kilkenny (Kenny's Church) honors him. St. Canice Cathedral has a rare round tower that people can climb.



We sacrifice in Lent not to make us miserable, but to remind that sacrifices made in love to help others will ultimately bring us joy. We can embrace delayed gratification more. Some want what they want, and they want it now, no matter its impact on others. We see this to often in selfish acts in the pretext of "freedom." Let us be willing to make a temporary sacrifice for the long-term care of others.

Christ offers the image of the grain of wheat that dies to bear more fruit as parable of sacrifice that also foreshadows his ultimate sacrifice. We embrace the smaller sacrifices and fasting of Lent, not only to delay the gratification of a greater reward, but also more selflessly and charitably respond to the needs and well-being of others. With the arrival of spring and the season of planting, let us patiently, sacrificially, and lovingly plant seeds that will bear great fruit in the future.

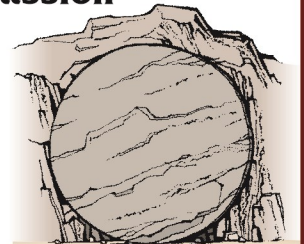

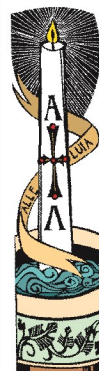

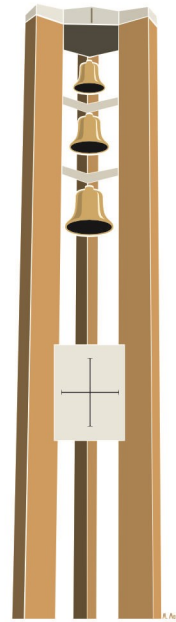

Caring for a loved one with dementia can be an emotional challenge. The Caregiver Support Group at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 19, at Smith Village, 2320 West 113<sup>th</sup> Place in Chicago, will take time to discuss ways to manage anxiety and stress and to access helpful resources.

This support group provides a confidential, safe and supportive environment and aims to combat the isolation many caregivers experience. Meetings are planned for the third Tuesday of every month.

“People with dementia often reflect the emotions of their caregivers,” says Alice Keane, group leader. “So, if a caregiver is anxious or impatient, a loved one will be as well. It is vital that caregivers have someone to help them manage their challenging role.” The group will share options on how best to care for the caregiver.

The meetings are free and open to all caring for someone with Alzheimer’s disease or other types of dementia. Alzheimer’s Association volunteers Alice Keane and Bridget Murphy, Smith Village life enrichment director, lead the group.

## Lenten Regulations

The Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The special paschal fast and abstinence are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.


## Bulletin Deadlines

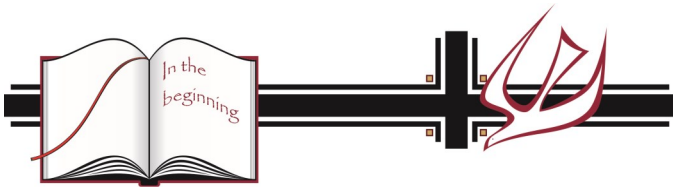
