ome television shows with an ongoing storyline will begin with a recap of earlier episodes labeled "Previously." One of my favorite parts of Luke's Gospel is the story of the Road to Emmaus, and today's Gospel begins with the report of two disciples who encountered Jesus on the road to Emmaus. Cleopas and an unnamed disciple left town, shaken by the crucifixion and the empty tomb, when they encountered the resurrected Christ. They failed to recognize him until the breaking of the bread. Then their eyes were open to the Good News of the Resurrection.

We are blessed to encounter the Risen Christ in Communion. We celebrate with special joy bread and wine that become the real presence of Christ. Luke never names the second disciple encountering Jesus on the way to Emmaus—we can imagine ourselves being the one to have our eyes opened by the loving presence of Christ each time we meet him in the Breaking of the Bread.

While the two deliver the amazing news to the other disciples, Jesus appears in their midst. They are initially startled and terrified, thinking they are seeing a ghost, a disembodied presence of the dead Jesus. The fear of ghosts that haunt this world terrify many people, but Jesus instead bears tranquility. He tells his frightened friends, "Peace be with you."

He makes his bodily presence manifest by revealing his wounded hands and feet. And if they had any lingering doubt, he asks for something to eat and eats it in their presence. (A couple asides—this counters and disproves some infamous PETA billboards that tried to claim that Jesus was vegan; and if you ever watch the television show *Ghosts*, an ongoing bit is that the ghosts cannot enjoy the taste of food, but at least can appreciate the aroma.)

The Gospel began with a recap and ends with a mission. Christ summarizes the scriptural foreshadowing of the events of Holy Week, then tasks the disciples with preaching repentance and sharing the faith in the Risen Lord, beginning from Jerusalem.

The Mass ends with the dismissal—one form calls all of us to "Go and announce the Gospel of

the Lord." That was not only the mission for the first disciples, but for us all. The name for our Eucharistic liturgy, "Mass," comes from the dismissing mission that Christ gives us all as we leave Church. We are all called to help renew the Church, the Body of Christ, by proclaiming the Gospel of the Risen Christ.



Tomorrow is dreaded Tax Day. Good luck if you are still working on your return. Please remember as we render unto Caesar, that we do not forget to render God's portion and support your parish through your stewardship. Thank you for all your Easter gifts and generosity of the season.

In October 2022, the Sanctuary Working Group asked Mercy Sisters Pat Murphy and JoAnn Persch to help an asylum-seeking mother and five children from Sierra Leone. They brought the need to the Chicago Mercy Justice Committee, who agreed to find funds, housing, and other family needs.

They founded CATHERINE'S CARING CAUSE, named for Sisters of Mercy foundress Catherine McAuley. CCC has situated nine families in homes with a mentor who helps enrolling kids in school and assisting with medical and legal issues. We are currently searching for two more homes. 



Another spring. The hoped-for rains came. The drought was




# Stewardship in Support of SJF

Every day, we have the opportunity to be the face of Jesus to others. Please consider making a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- 1. If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- 2. The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3. Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

# **Light of the World**

Prayer with our children often begins with a game. At sunset we turn off the lights and sit close together in a quiet, darkening house. We hold the younger children close so they won't get frightened in the dark, and we say, "Let's see how quiet we can be."

After a few moments the squirming and giggling begin to fade. A few minutes more and the silence starts to build. Slowly we find ourselves embraced by an ever-deepening sense of stillness.

As the quiet grows, we feel the hushed amazement of our children as they suddenly realize that our silent room is actually teeming with sound. They begin to sense neighbors talking, playing, shouting, living. Gradually, fainter sounds begin to claim a place: a factory whistle, the hum of machinery somewhere, a far-off siren. The longer we listen, the more we hear of the world around us.

We let this life-filled silence build in us until it seems ready to burst. Then we light our candle, proclaim Jesus Christ "the light of the world," and begin our prayer, much more receptive, much more aware of our connections to others, than we had been a few minutes before.




